Individual consultations are offered to graduate students or future graduate students who are applying for external funding. You will have the opportunity to have your project summary reviewed by a senior postdoc or research associate in a 20 minute appointment. The reviewer will scan the document and provide feedback on the structure, relevance, and language accuracy with suggestions on how to improve the draft.

You must register in advance for an individual consultation, an email will follow with information about registration.

Many health science researchers are not aware of the incredible diversity of career options they can pursue and need some guidance in learning how to explore these options. The Peer Career Groups (PCG) program provides an opportunity to explore self and career from A to Z. Similar group coaching programs offered by private career counselors cost up to \$1000. Our program, offered by CaPS and D-CAT, is **FREE** for McGill students and fellows.

Over the 6 months in the program you will:

- Actively engage in self-reflection through structured exercises to reveal individual strengths, values and interests
- Engage in individual activities and discuss your progress in peer triads (we will match you with peers who are similar in terms of training and goals).
- Participate in 5 workshops designed to introduce the next stage of work you will do on your own and with your triads.
- Work with a small group of peers to foster a supportive network for discussing individual strengths, values, and interests to gain additional insights and perspectives.
- Obtain information about a variety of career paths both through independent research and networking with PCG participants.
